A list of the most magnificent wonders which ancient civilizations have produced, including the Egyptian pyramids, the ancient city and temples at Machu Picchu in Peru, and the ancient temples at Angkor in Cambodia, should not omit the rock-cut cave temples of India, especially the large Kailas complex at Ellora.

Murals in Ellora are found in five caves. The paintings are related to hindu, buddhist and jain traditions. Most of the murals are limited to the Kailasha temple. Murals were done in two phases: In the first phase, paintings were done during the carvings of the caves, while the second phase ones were done during several centuries later.
