The Gospel according to Mark (Greek: Εὐαγγέλιον κατὰ Μάρκον, romanized: Euangélion katà Mārkon), also called the Gospel of Mark, or simply Mark, is the second of the four canonical gospels and of the three synoptic gospels. It tells of the ministry of Jesus from his baptism by John the Baptist to his death and burial and the discovery of Jesus' empty tomb.

For my first foray into preaching a Gospel, I choose Mark because my congregation is gentile, just like the intended primary audience of Mark (written to Roman Christians). Author: Although the Gospel of Mark does not name its author, it is the unanimous testimony of early church fathers that Mark was the author. He was an associate of the Apostle Peter, and evidently his spiritual son (1 Peter 5:13). From Peter he received first-hand information of the events and teachings of the Lord, and preserved the information in written form.
